(John 13:38b)</p>
<p>Now Peter was sitting out in the courtyard, (26:69a)</p>	<p>While Peter was below in the courtyard, (14:66a)</p>	<p>Then seizing him, they led him away and took him into the house of the high priest. Peter followed at a distance. And when some there had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and had sat down together, Peter sat down with them. (22:54–55)</p>	<p>Simon Peter and another disciple were following Jesus. Because this disciple was known to the high priest, he went with Jesus into the high priest’s courtyard, but Peter had to wait outside at the door. The other disciple, who was known to the high priest, came back, spoke to the servant girl on duty there and brought Peter in. (18:15–16)</p>
<p>and a servant girl came to him. “You also were with Jesus of Galilee,” she said. But he denied it before them all. “I don’t know what you’re talking about,” he said. (26:69b–70)</p>	<p>one of the servant girls of the high priest came by. When she saw Peter warming himself, she looked closely at him. “You also were with that Nazarene, Jesus,” she said. But he denied it. “I don’t know or understand what you’re talking about,” he said, (14:66b–68a)</p>	<p>A servant girl saw him seated there in the firelight. She looked closely at him and said, “This man was with him.” But he denied it. “Woman, I don’t know him,” he said. (22:56–57)</p>	<p>“You aren’t one of this man’s disciples too, are you?” she asked Peter. ¶ He replied, “I am not.” (18:17)</p>

<p>Then he went out to the gateway, where another servant girl saw him and said to the people there, "This fellow was with Jesus of Nazareth." He denied it again, with an oath: "I don't know the man!" (26:71-72)</p>	<p>and went out into the entryway. When the servant girl saw him there, she said again to those standing around, "This fellow is one of them." Again he denied it. (14:68b-70a)</p>	<p>A little later someone else saw him and said, "You also are one of them." "Man, I am not!" Peter replied. (22:58)</p>	<p>It was cold, and the servants and officials stood around a fire they had made to keep warm. Peter also was standing with them, warming himself. (18:18) Meanwhile, Simon Peter was still standing there warming himself. So they asked him, "You aren't one of his disciples too, are you?" He denied it, saying, "I am not." 18:25)</p>
<p>After a little while, those standing there went up to Peter and said, "Surely you are one of them; your accent gives you away." Then he began to call down curses, and he swore to them, "I don't know the man!" (26:73-74a)</p>	<p>After a little while, those standing near said to Peter, "Surely you are one of them, for you are a Galilean." He began to call down curses, and he swore to them, "I don't know this man you're talking about." (14:70b-71)</p>	<p>About an hour later another asserted, "Certainly this fellow was with him, for he is a Galilean." Peter replied, "Man, I don't know what you're talking about!" (22:59-60a)</p>	<p>One of the high priest's servants, a relative of the man whose ear Peter had cut off, challenged him, "Didn't I see you with him in the garden?" Again Peter denied it, (18:26-27a)</p>
<p>Immediately a rooster crowed. (26:74b)</p>	<p>Immediately the rooster crowed the second time. Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken to him: "Before the rooster crows twice you will disown me three times." And he broke down and wept. (14:72)</p>	<p>Just as he was speaking, the rooster crowed. (22:60b)</p>	<p>and at that moment a rooster began to crow. (18:27b)</p>
